View22 project to continue

The cooperative art project View22: Painting Jackson Hole's Open Spaces is continuing this year with new artists, locations and opportunities.

The venture began in 2013 with Jackson Hole Land Trust inviting painters from Trio Fine Art to work on location on lands preserved through the trust.

This year three new artists join View22: Kay Northrup, represented at Trailside Galleries; Lee Riddell, represented at WRJ Home; and Travis Walker, represented at Altamira Fine Art. Trio artists Jennifer Hoffman, Kathryn Turner and Bill Sawczuk also return.

Out of 18 locations where people will paint this summer, 12 are new, and this year four demonstrations will be open to the public. Opportunities include events at the National Museum of Wildlife Art, the land trust's annual picnic, the Jackson Hole Mountain Resort "Deck" Happy Hour, and the Hardeman Barns outside Wilson. More events may be scheduled.

The project will culminate in a December exhibit benefiting the Land Trust and land protection projects in Jackson Hole. The event will be held Dec. 11.
