

Wyoming receives first forest legacy program project

A unique program recently permanently protected 236 acres of a vital elk migration corridor in Jackson.

The Munger Mountain Corridor Project is on private ranchlands and connects elk feedgrounds to the national forest. It

It is a partnership between the Jackson Hole Land Trust, U.S. Forest Service, Wyoming Game and Fish Department, Wyoming State Forestry Division, Wyoming Wildlife and Natural Resource Trust, and the Snake River Ranch. It is the first project in Wyoming to receive Forest Legacy Program money.
